LEGISLATIVE ACTION: WORKING ON YOUR BEHALF IN HARRISBURG

We are more than halfway through the 2025-26 Legislative Session, and across Pennsylvania, members of the General Assembly are working hard to advocate for the bills important to them and their districts. I am happy to provide an update on the following legislative initiatives I sponsored.

BUDGET COMPROMISE INVESTS IN STUDENTS, LAW ENFORCEMENT WITHOUT DRAINING STATE SAVINGS

On July 12, the General Assembly passed the 2026-27 state budget with my support. I voted for a compromise that strengthens education funding, including Pennsylvania Higher Education Assistance Agency (PHEAA) grants to help students pay for education post-graduation; supports law enforcement; and increases resources for domestic violence services and senior programs. These priorities reflect the needs of Cumberland County and the 88th District, where our communities continue to grow.

This budget delivers historic education funding. Every school in Pennsylvania will be better equipped to teach our future leaders, and local districts - including Cumberland Valley, West Shore and Mechanicsburg Area - will see increases through adequacy gap formula changes I advocated for last year.

It also invests in services that help seniors stay in their homes, supports victims of domestic violence and funds training and cold case work under the VICTIM Act to enhance community safety.

Importantly, the budget achieves these goals without raising taxes or using the Rainy Day Fund, preserving our long-term financial stability.

As with any compromise, it includes spending I would prefer to limit. At \$50.8 billion, it is higher than I hoped. However, it supports key priorities without jeopardizing the Commonwealth's fiscal health. Last year's policy changes championed by House Republicans will continue to promote economic growth and provide more flexibility in future budgets.

Our communities are well-positioned for continued stability and progress. It remains essential for the Legislature to work together to pass a responsible budget, so state and local governments can continue delivering vital services.

PROTECT YOURSELF FROM SCAMS: WHAT YOU NEED TO KNOW

Did you know? The Pennsylvania Office of the Attorney General works year-round to protect residents from scams through education, alerts and consumer support. Its resources help citizens recognize, avoid and report fraud, including programs for seniors, identity theft prevention, insurance fraud awareness and seasonal scam alerts.

HERE ARE SOME TIPS TO HELP YOU AVOID SCAMS:



STAY INFORMED.

Sign up for consumer alerts from the PA Office of Attorney General to learn about new and emerging scams.



VERIFY BEFORE YOU TRUST.

Never share personal or financial information until you've confirmed who you're speaking with. Be especially cautious if someone requests payment through gift cards, cryptocurrency or wire transfers.



PROTECT PERSONAL DATA.

Keep sensitive documents secure and regularly review bank statements and credit reports for unusual activity.



BE CAUTIOUS WITH INSURANCE DEALINGS.

Verify that agents are licensed, avoid signing blank documents and keep copies of all paperwork.

If you believe you've been targeted, act quickly if something feels suspicious. You can file a complaint using the Office of Attorney General's online Scams Complaint Form at attorneygeneral.gov. REMEMBER TO STAY VIGILANT.

Scammers often use fear, urgency or excitement to pressure victims into making quick decisions. Take your time, double check the source and remember: if it doesn't feel right, it probably isn't. Reporting suspicious activity helps protect you and your community!
